

“Catching the Wave to Eagle”

Advancement Opportunities at Camperall

Welcome to Pacifica District's 2012 Webelos Camperall. Your Webelos Patrols will be tackling a number of challenges throughout the Saturday events to test their Scouting skills.

As they are “Catching the Wave to Eagle”, they will have an opportunity to experience Boy Scouting at its best. In fact, a number of the skills and effort they will demonstrate during the weekend fall under the category of both Webelos and Boy Scout rank advancement requirements.

There will be the opportunity for them to fulfill requirements for the following:

1. Sportsman Activity Badge

- ◆ Requirement # 4) While you are a Webelos Scout, earn Cub Scout Sports belt loops for two team sports (baseball, basketball, soccer, softball, volleyball, flag football, or ultimate).

2. Traveler Activity Badge

- ◆ Requirement # 3 - With the help of your parent, guardian, teacher, or librarian, use a map site on the Internet to plan a trip from your home to a nearby place of interest. Download and/or print the directions and street map showing how to go from your home to the place you chose.
- ◆ Requirement # 4 -With your parent or guardian, take a trip to a place that interests you. Go by car, bus, boat, train, or plane.
- ◆ Requirement # 5 - Figure out what it costs per mile for the trip you took or planned to fulfill requirement 2, 4, 6, or 7. (Don't forget to include getting back to your starting point.
- ◆ Requirement # 7 - Decide on a trip you would like to take that lasts at least two days. Pack everything you would need for that trip.
- ◆ Requirement # 8 - Check the first aid kit in the family car to see if it contains what is needed. Explain what you found.

3. Readyman Activity Badge

- ◆ Requirement # 2 - Explain what first aid is. Tell what you should do after an accident.
- ◆ Requirement # 3 - Explain how you can get help quickly if there is an emergency in your home.
- ◆ Requirement # 5 - Show what to do for these "hurry cases":
 - A. Stopped Breathing
 - B. Internal Poisoning
 - C. (will not be covering serious bleeding or heart attack)
- ◆ Requirement # 7 - Show first aid for the following:

A. Burns and scalds

4. Outdoorsman Activity Badge (Two out of # 1, # 2 or # 3) (Five of requirements # 5 through 12)

- ◆ Requirement # 1 - Present yourself to your Webelos den leader, properly dressed, as you would be for an overnight campout. Show the camping gear you will use. Show the right way to pack and carry it.
- ◆ Requirement # 2 - Present yourself to your Webelos den leader, properly dressed, as you would be for an overnight campout. Show the camping gear you will use. Show the right way to pack and carry it.
- ◆ Requirement # 3 - With your parent or guardian, take part in a Webelos den overnight campout or a family campout. Sleep in a tent that you have helped pitch.
- ◆ Requirement # 8 - With your accompanying adult on a campout or outdoor activity, assist in preparing, cooking, and cleanup for one of your den's meals. Tell why it is important for each den member to share in meal preparation and cleanup, and explain the importance of eating together.
- ◆ Requirement # 11 - Demonstrate setting up a tent or dining fly using two half hitches and a taut-line hitch. Show how to tie a square knot and explain how it is used.
- ◆ Requirement # 12 - Visit a nearby Boy Scout camp with your Webelos den.

5. Citizen Activity Badge

- ◆ Requirement # 3 - Describe the flag of the United States and give a short history of it. With another Webelos Scout helping you, show how to hoist and lower the flag, how to hang it horizontally and vertically on a wall, and how to fold it. Tell how to retire a worn or tattered flag properly.

- ◆ Requirement # 2 - Show your knowledge of the requirements to become a Boy Scout by doing all of these:
- ◆ Repeat from memory and explain in your own words the Scout Oath or Promise and the 12 points of the Scout Law. Tell how you have practiced them in your everyday life.
- ◆ Give and explain the Scout motto, slogan, sign, salute, and handshake.
- ◆ Understand the significance of the First Class Scout badge. Describe its parts and tell what each stands for.
- ◆ Tie the joining knot (square knot)

- ◆ Requirement # 3 - With your Webelos den, visit at least one Boy Scout-oriented outdoor activity.
- ◆ Requirement # 5 - Participate in a Webelos overnight campout or day hike.
- ◆ Requirement # 6 - After you have completed all five of the above requirements, and after a talk with your Webelos den leader, arrange to visit, with your parent or guardian, a meeting of a Boy Scout troop you think you might like to join. Have a conference with the Scoutmaster.
